unrelenting compassion, kindness and community allegiance that has long typified the Old West End, the Expressive Therapies Center Toledo (**The Center**) is a non-profit organization administering to the multitude of needs of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), as well as those experiencing crisis due to a traumatic event by innovatively leveraging the broad healing properties inherent in Art, Music, and Dance Movement therapies.

Founded in 2015 to close the PTSD treatment gap shouldered by Veterans, The Center now opens its doors to any individual suffering from PTSD, traumatic crisis and any resident of the OWE who wishes to participate in the emotional regulatory program using the techniques found in the expressive arts.

The Center, which offers an affordable, alternative means to life-changing mental and emotional health care, places its focus on accomplishing (3) major goals. First, by bringing the healing power of the arts to those dealing with crisis in their lives. Secondly, through a commitment by volunteers and staff to sincerely serve those entrusted to their care. And thirdly, through an adherence to a "never say never" approach to full mental health restoration where healing might initially appear impractical, or worse still, impossible.

The OWE Preservation Committee is moving forward on preservation of the Collingwood Art Center's "Tea House". Committee members toured the CAC campus on March 3 and discussed plans for securing the house, located at the entrance to CAC, in anticipation of renovation when funds allow. Boards have been cut for the unsecured openings; the Arts Commission will be working with us to decorate the boards before installation (hopefully before Festival).

A "Tea House" cleanup is scheduled for Saturday, April 15, from 9 am to 1 pm at the Collingwood Arts Center. Projected activities include trash cleanup inside/outside, securing doors/windows, and general yard maintenance. Volunteers should bring their own work gloves. So here is a little history on one way streets, it prevents drivers from cutting through residential streets to bypass traffic lights or otherwise known as a rat run. It calms traffic, especially in historic city centers.

So decide the way you want to go however the Toledo Municipal code section for driving on one way street is 331.28 and the Ohio Revised Code section is 4511.32. Now the fun part when you go the wrong way hopefully you will be greeted by Toledo's finest.


