OLD WEST END About 50 neighbors SECURITY attended the Old West End Security meeting on July 7. We thank them, and those of you who shared your opinions with us for taking part in an important conversation.

Discussion at the meeting focused on the question: What would it take for you to feel secure in the Old West End?

Two issues were paramount: concerns about armed security patrols in the neighborhood, and concerns about how neighbors could organize effectively to address problems related to property crime.

On the first issue: A majority indicated that armed security patrols make them feel less secure. That's not something Old West End Security can contribute to therefore we will not be resuming armed patrols in the neighborhood unless that changes.

On the second issue: It is still an open question what we as neighbors can do to address problems related to crime in the neighborhood. Several neighbors volunteered to continue being involved with Old West End Security and to work together to develop a viable plan going forward. We will continue to keep you informed, and ask that you continue to share your suggestions and opinions. You can email oldwestendsecurity@gmail.com.

WHAT ARE YOU COOKING?

From Carol Kutsche: During Covid and my bread baking, I found this recipe for **Cornbread without any flour!** Here it is:

2T.melted shortening

2 t. baking powde

1 t. salt

1 egg

2 C. Stone Ground Corn Meal

1 t. soda

2 T. Honey (optional)

1& 3/4 C. buttermilk

Mix all together and put batter in a heated cast iron skillet that was used to melt the shortening. Bake at 400 for 25-35 min. until brown. Spread with butter and honey - if you like - and eat!

CANOPY TREES

The Women of the Old West End received a response to a letter written to Commissioner, Karen Ranney-Wolkins of the City Division of Parks, Recreation and Forestry. Hopefully, soon, a meeting will take place to discuss a tree inventory and replacing missing canopy trees In The Old West End Historic District.

Over the last few years, the City of Tole-do reconstructed Collingwood Boulevard from Monroe Street to Central Avenue and Bancroft from Monroe Street to Ashland Avenue. The City, over the objetions of the residents, removed all the mature trees that existed for both reconstruction projects.

The magnificent elms that once lined Collingwood Avenue were lost to Dutch Elm disease, and the mature honey locusts were lost to the latest street reconstruction projects.

The residents were promised an extensive replanting of trees that would someday restore the Canopy trees to these streets. However a number of the trees planted since reconstruction on Collingwood and Bancroft have not survived and need to be restored according to the plans approved during the Federal Section 106 design process. We will keep you informed.

DISTRICT 4 and the Warren Commons Project

WOWE and our Attorney Terry Lodge continue work on this. The Warren Commons Project is to be another Drug & Alcohol facility for District 4. Out of 40 known Drug and Alcohol facilities, District 4 has 26 - way over our limit!


