Why Have Your House on the Old West End House Tour?

We hosted our house in the most recent Old West End House tour, and we were asked why people should want to open up their houses for tours. We have lived in the Old West End for 14 years, and, although we have enjoyed going on tours, and I have enjoyed volunteering as a tour guide, we really hadn't considered much having our own house on tour. Our first reactions when someone asked us if we'd want to put our house on tour were "how can we compete with these mansions we've seen?", "but our house is too small...," "why would people be interested in seeing OUR house?" would our house be save?" and, of course "wouldn't it be a lot of work and a headache?'

I then thought about why I liked to go on tours and why I liked to volunteer to be a tour guide. I liked learning about the history and architecture. I liked the guided tours where the docents would give information about the details in the house I would have missed otherwise. I liked how each house I saw was unique in its own way. I realized that, although mine was not one of the huge mansions in the Old West End, if I were a visitor, I would be very interested to see it. I recalled that one reason I moved to Toledo and to the Old West End was the facade that caught my eye, and then the arts and crafts details of the house. What made the house special for us was the way we decorated it, with furnishings we had collected while living overseas, and we realized that other people would like to learn more about the architecture, and the history behind our furnishings and decorations would make for interesting scripts for the docents showing our house, and would fascinate visitors.

Would this be a daunting experience? There was a lot of work involved for us, because we were in the middle of stripping paint that had covered our paneling since the 50's. I spent months stripping paint, sanding, restaining, and finishing woodwork. We had some floors redone and some repairs made to the ceiling and woodwork. These were projects that we were going to do anyway, but we did it on a more compressed time frame. We had some help from a friend to show the house, and the house tour committee and our house captains met with us offered help with cleaning windows, power washing, and tips for showing the house well. They met with us several times to plan the logistics of the tour, put us at ease on security issues, and assured us that everything in the house would remain intact.

A friend of mine has been staying in Toledo and the OWE in particular for an extended period of time. Like so many of us, he was struck by the grandeur of the houses the first time he came to visit. He happened to be staying during this year's Festival and was inspired by our burgeoning community and our stellar event. He has been seeking properties in the neighborhood and hopes to put an anchor here. This is our success story as a neighborhood.

Part of the intrigue for this friend is the diversity and untapped potential of our community. In the course of his real estate search and his own community-building, he spoke to some of our neighbors. These people, who live in the neighborhood, remarked that they didn't attend festival because they didn't feel welcome. I was dismayed to learn this but not entirely surprised. This is one of our many challenges as a neighborhood.

Our historic district (the Old West End Historic District) was created at a fixed time an in a somewhat arbitrary fashion to ensure historic preservation of homes of a certain age. Our neighborhood (the Old West End) was developed to identify a community who shared location in common. Our neighborhood association (the Old West End Association) was developed to promote a shared set of values on behalf of the residents of the Old West End. Among these core values is the creation of a community atmosphere to celebrate our diverse neighborhood, as well as ensuring dissemination of accurate information about the neighborhood.

One current initiative to accomplish these two goals is greater distribution of our newsletter within the neighborhood. At present, the Historic District is fairly well represented at our neighborhood events, while many outside the Historic District do not receive our newsletter and accordingly, aren't necessarily aware of what's happening in the neighborhood. I'm hoping that sharing our official means of communication will encourage others to participate. Please contact me if you'd like to help with this endeavor.

The OWEA's July meeting featured Analese Alvarez, Executive Director of Equality Toledo. Analese shared with the group the important work by Equality Toledo in our neighborhood in the form of a Food Pantry that serves hundreds of families, largely from our area. Our August meeting will be our annual picnic, and will take place August 21 at 6:30 in the Arboretum. The Association will provide a main dish and beverages, so please feel free to bring a side dish or dessert to share (and a chair!). Hope to see you there.

August security tips: Make sure your house number is easily visible from the street. When an emergency strikes, every second counts. Make sure that police, firefighters, and/or paramedics can quickly find the right house by keeping your house numbers visible.

Have a solid front door and make sure you can see who is at the door before you open it. Over one third of burglars enter a home through the front door. A flimsy or hollow door can be kicked in within seconds. Have a solid front door and install a peep hole. Wide angle peep holes are best because they offer the greatest range of view. Ring doorbell or similar video doorbell technology are also a great idea.

Windows account for a quarter of all break-in entry points. That's because they are frequently left unlocked, or outfitted with cheap window locks make them vulnerable to attack. Make it difficult for anyone to get in with help from secondary locks and window sensors.

Bancroft Decorative Street Lights Finally Installed

It's hard to believe the lights along Bancroft are finally installed. We all knew it would be difficult, but never, in our wildest dreams, did we imagine it would take this long.

The process began in 2013 with the first public meeting held by the City where volunteers were asked to sit on the Design Review Team (DRT). Over the next 18 months, the DRT worked with City staff and residents to develop a conceptual design for Bancroft. In 2014 final designs were complete and construction commenced. Several volunteers (now known as the BBC) continued to meet to ensure the plans were implemented. The biggest item of concern was the lights. The project budget financed the cost of purchasing and installing the lights, but someone had to cover annual maintenance costs. Multiple approaches were considered. The chosen approach required our council representative at the time to put forth legislation. Unfortunately, our council representative became our mayor and legislation was never completed. After 2 years of persistent follow up by the BBC the City agreed to bear the ongoing assessment cost. This was accomplished through participation in a special LED pilot program and the legislation was passed in July 2017. Unfortunately there was another roadblock. First Energy changed the selection of lights and the BBC was told the

For the next year, the BBC pushed back on First Energy and the City until the originally chosen lights were installed.

When members of the BBC agreed to volunteer they never imagined their service would be for such an extended period of time. These individuals deserve a big THANK YOU! For without their persistent efforts Bancroft would not be what it is today. 
