Old West End Tree Nursery

The all-volunteer Old West End Tree Nursery received a \$8435 grant from Toledo Rotary Club/Greater Toledo Community Foundation. This grant will fund an infrastructure that allows the tree nursery to raise nearly 2000 trees at a time. Once mature, the trees will be distributed for FREE to homeowners, faith communities, nonprofits, businesses, and anyone else who would like to improve our urban forest. The grant also provides a modest amount of funding for youth work opportunities.

In order to stretch the funding, we are doing much of the work ourselves. This fall and winter, we will build the infrastructure at a workspace donated by Ohlman's Greenhouse. We need volunteers to help with this work.

The tree nursery is on the 400 block of Floyd and receives critical support from Collingwood Presbyterian Church and the Women of the Old West End. If you are interested in volunteering, please contact Michael Szuberla at mszuberla@ vahoo.com or 419-245-4539.

Dear Old West Enders,

Last week our friend Matt Wiederhold, Executive Director of Heritage Ohio, hosted a Zoom meeting for folks working on historic architecture throughout the state. The Cleveland Restoriation Society is working on a fund to maintain historically Black churches. The Cincinnati Preservation Association is helping neighborhoods identify what "preservation" means for them and what are their preservation priorities. I filled in for our Preservation Committee, and I got to share updates about the WGTE Toledo Story, the CGL grant for Historic Guidelines for our neighborhood, the plans to improve Glenwood and Romanoff Parks, and the work on 624 Delaware. They were impressed with what we have been able to accomplish as an all volunteer organization, and I felt really proud of our neighborhood. My favorite thing about our neighbor is how engaged we are. We have so many neighbors who are willing to make something happen, and for me that's leadership.

Each of these projects has taken leadership. Each one began as "someone should really work on this" or "the Old West End Association should really do this" and each time a person or a team has decided that, instead of telling someone else what they should be doing, they would just get to work on it.

Each of these projects has become bigger than it was first imagined. In 2021, few people predicted how energizing the work on 624 Delaware would be for the Preservation Committee and for the whole neighborhood. I've heard project manager Tom Guyton say that this project is worth much more than the house itself. It's become a place to learn, to share talents, and, since it began, Preservation Committee meetings have tripled

in size, in part due to excitement about actually preserving a house. Their vision, as they expressed at this past Association meeting, is to finish and sell the house, using proceeds to begin work on the next project.

Leadership in our neighborhood also looks like trying new things. Jackie Lay, Kira Alvitre, and Judy Stone hosted a fantastic 'Newbies' party for folks who have come to the neighborhood in the past three years. Leadership looks like asking challenging guestions about how we plan to fund our growing projects like our Treasurer, Kim Howard, has been asking and challenging us to prioritize. Leadership also looks like accepting a formal role on the OWE Association Board so that each of these projects has oversight and support from neighbors who are willing to meet monthly to carry out the objectives of the Association.

Last month we held an election for our Board. I want to thank everyone who accepted a nomination to be a leader in this neighborhood organization. I want to congratulate our new trustee, Laure Hammond, and our new Vice President, Nick Malenda. Kim Howard will return as treasurer, and I will return for one more year to the role of President where I commit to listening to the center and the margins of the OWE, to implementing our new strategic plans, and to collaborating with more excellent leaders in our neighborhood to keep our momentum going.



OLD WEST END SECURITY

The mission of Old West End Security has always been to make the Old West End a safer and more secure neighborhood for all our neighbors. Thank you for your continued support and involvement in that effort. Times change, technology changes, and our neighborhood has changed. The current model, using supporter fees to hire a private company to provide patrols as a deterrent against crime, has run its course. As neighbors have focused on community networks for sharing information and responding to issues, as well as shifting to new methods securing their private property, numbers of supporters have dwindled. We no longer have sufficient support or engagement to provide patrols at a rate that serves as an effective deterrent.

THIS IS A GOOD THING. The majority of the Old West End no longer feels a need for third-party patrols in the neighborhood.... which means that after 30+ years, OWES has fulfilled our mission. As such, OWES is in the process of winding down operations. We are hosting a community meeting to discuss our plans and answer any questions on Monday, December 4, at Kent Branch Library (Central and Collingwood), from 7-8 pm. COMMONS PARK SIGN

Many of you may not know but the Commons Park sign is the last of these kind of sign in all the City Parks. This sign was installed in 1976. WOWE went to the City in the early 70's to request that the vacant land become a park for the OWE. The city agreed and a park was built and dedicated with this magnificent sign.




