This service costs only \$15/month, an annual subscription costs \$200 including the bin fee. BUT, for the entire month of February, anyone that signs up and pays the entire fee up front will receive a FREE compost bin, saving you

# Letter from the President

Last month I reviewed the OWEA organization, Trustees, and succession plans. If you missed it, you can find it on the OWEA website: <a href="http://www.toledooldwestend.com/historic-times">http://www.toledooldwestend.com/historic-times</a>

This month, I would like to provide an overview of the OWEA's finances, fundraising efforts, our financial goals, and how we are reinvesting back into the neighborhood.

If you didn't know, the OWEA Festival is the primary fundraising event for the Association. The Festival is held the first Saturday and Sunday of June. This year the festival will be on June 5 & 6. The past two years the Festival has netted ~\$30,000. We take those funds and cover our annual budget and split the excess funds and put half into our Endowment Fund and the other half into the Neighborhood Beautification & Improvement fund (also known as the NB&I fund). The Endowment fund was started with the proceeds from Mansion View and as mentioned, each year we add to

that with Festival proceeds. Currently, the Endowment Fund is \$240,000. Our goal is to build that to \$500,000 so that the interest can be used to fund our annual budget, leaving all the money generated by festival to be used for NB&I grants. Reinvestment could be investment in projects or could cover a part-time grant writer for the neighborhood. Anyway, we aren't there yet, but we are almost half-way to our goal. Stay tuned.

I mentioned the NB&I fund, so let me tell you more about it. This money is available to any neighbor or group with an idea which will benefit the neighborhood. All you have to do is fill out a simple 1 page form (found on our website). The criteria for receiving funds is that it must be of public (not personal) benefit, and the author must have a sustainable, concrete plan turning the idea into reality. To date we have put more than \$35,000 into the neighborhood. Some of the projects have included the historic benches along Bancroft and Collingwood, planters on Scottwood & Virginia, Tiffany stained glass restoration funds for the First Congregational Church, and the Collingwood Arts Center loading dock rehab, just to name a few. The NB&I fund is not possible without the funds raised during festival.

You can learn more about our finances and ask questions of our fabulous Treasurer, John Shaw, by coming to an OWEA meeting. Meetings are always the 3rd Tuesday of the month at 7 PM. The location changes, but the location is stated in the Historic Times as well as on the website. We are continuing to restructure the format of the meeting to allow for more discussion. We hand out written committee reports which creates more time for dialog on topics of interest to the attendees. I challenge everyone reading this article to attend a meeting and bring your thoughts and ideas or come to meet neighbors. All are welcome. 
This district includes, OWE, Downtown, Uptown, Warren Sherman, TOTCO, North Toledo and is represented by Councilwoman Yvonne Harper. District 4 also has the largest concentration of Drug & Alcohol facilities and is now facing a 60 Unit apartment & rehab facility at the corner of Woodruff & Franklin. Out of 40 Drug & Rehab facilities, District 4 has 26 of them (that the city knows of...we are sure that there are more). WOWE filed an appeal to the Plan Commission who approved this facility which will house felons coming out of prison or jail. The Plan Commission claims that letters were sent to all of the adjoining property owners. WOWE has spoken with several of these homeowners and business owners and they did not receive any notice of a meeting to discuss this current project or situation. Letters were also to be sent to WOWE and the OWEA, neither organization received this letter and when we asked, the Plan Commission said it was sent...the Post Office must have lost it. NOT!! WOWE's Attorney has sent a letter to the Plan Commission & City Council Members regarding all of the violations of the Municipal Code regarding this project.

This writer knows that many of you probably know this but some do not. With Spring just around the corner, some neighbors may not know that if they are planning on doing any exterior work on their home ie; new windows, porch, driveway etc. they will need a COA (Cer-




tificate of Appropriateness) from the Plan Commission and an appearance at a Historic District Commission Meeting. If you are planning to do ANY exterior work on your home call **Molly McGuire** at the Plan Commission for details. 419-245-1200.

#### BANCROFT

Members of the Bancroft Beautification Committee will be meeting with the Mayor's office again soon. A Pedestrian & Car activated Traffic Light is still very much needed at Bancroft and Scottwood. It's been disheartening to work with the Transportation Dept. and certain City offices for the past 6+ years to get this situation resolved. The City's newly installed electronic speed signs on Bancroft letting you know how fast you are going do not work. I saw a car that just kept going after it said "going fast slow down". I'm sure they were doing at least 45-50 MPH. We are still aware that individuals with disabilities, pedestrians and those on bicycles are still having trouble crossing Bancroft. And a request for a handicap parking space on Bancroft was turned down. Go figure. We will work to get this resolved too. There is also still a "line of site" problem at Scottwood going South to Bancroft. The parking next to Ann Manor on Bancroft is the problem. I'm hoping we have a better resolution after the upcoming meeting regarding this issue. Stay tuned and ...


