

We have the privilege of living in a National Historic District and the responsibility for working to preserve our neighborhood for future generations. Currently Columbia Gas is restoring gas lines to properties within the neighborhood and moving gas meters from inside houses to

The Historic period when most of these homes was constructed preceded the use of gas as locations outside. fuel. At one time most of the homes were heated from a central steam plant.

At issue is the fact that our historic neighborhood is protected by Toledo Municipal Code rules that require that any "environmental change" in a Historic District to a structure or landscape needs a Certificate Of Appropriateness from the Old West End Historic Commission. Columbia Gas is currently destroying sandstone sidewalks and curb stones, and wanting to place gas meters in the front of properties that defy the historic period within the Old West End. Columbia Gas already found by court order that they needed to work with the Historic German Village in Columbus Ohio. You as a property owner are expected to obey the rules, and so should Columbia Gas.

In the 60's and 70's there was little green space or park area where families could gather in the Old West End. In 1974 Women of The Old West End approached the city to have a park built for the Old West End where a house once stood at the corner of Bancroft and Robinwood. This was before the entire neighborhood was placed on the National Register of Historic Places and empty lots became gas stations or carry outs. Women of The Old West End were very aware of this and implored the city to help build a park for the residents. We held our breath as the central city was not always a place for the city to spend their money in 60's & 70's. We persevered and the city agreed to help. WOWE made the park a reality. The first park was designed as an Amphitheater with a stage at one end, and at the other end, near Robinwood, a raised sitting area with flower beds. The center of the park was bowl shaped for lawn sitting. This was a remarkable accomplishment for WOWE and our neighborhood.

In 1976 the newly build Commons Park was dedicated with music, food and a play called "The Spirit of the Commons". The Commons was filled to capacity. From this time on all Food Vendors for The Old West End Festival (which WOWE chaired from 1969-1985) were now placed in the Commons Park instead of on Bancroft.

In 1998, the Commons was in much need of repair. The stage and sitting area were designed of timbers and both areas were begining to deteriorate. There were also ADA issues for the park as well. WOWE again met with the City of Toledo, Department of Natural Resources to discuss how the park could be upgraded. At this same time the city was looking for citizens to adopt their neighborhood parks. WOWE agreed to adopt the Commons Park if the city would be willing to use CIP (Community Improvement Funds) to help rebuild the Commons. WOWE matched a \$10,000 Urban Forestry Grant to add additional decorative trees for the newly designed Commons Park.


