

Dear Old West Enders.

The other week at the Black Kite, Dave Kosmyna (the chair of the OWE Historic District Committee) mentioned something to me that has stayed with me since: when people enter the Old West End they should be able to feel as if they are in a different area than the rest of Toledo. From his perspective, the Historic District is not about being persnickety about historic specificity, it's about place-making. If I understood correctly, he would say that this Historic District is about creating an aura of distinctiveness, restoring the features that evoke this feeling where needed, and coordinating both neighbors' and the city's efforts to make this feeling possible.

Dave pointed out the new shelters for bus stops on Collingwood. Their style has nothing to do with the rest of the street and their opaque sides block the view of the streetscape. When the stops first went in, I was just happy that our bus-riding neighbors had shelter. I didn't consider the place-making implications. Along with Dave, I wish TARTA had consulted with the Historic District Commission to find some sort of compromise for shelter and for our historic home.

When I first began to attend Old West End meetings, any mention of 'Preservation' sounded defensive to me. It was always some folks trying to stop a neighbor or the City from doing something. I've come to learn that this is part of 'Preservation.'

Beyond that, though, preservation is place-making. Preservation is attending to the streetscape and tree canopy. Preservation is connecting more intentionally with our city officials to ensure that sweeping policies don't affect our homes adversely. Preservation is education. Preservation is networking with other Historic Districts around the region and learning from anyone who will teach us. Preservation is workdays at 624 Delaware. Preservation is sweat, blood, and tears, as I've heard many of you say.

WOWE Matches a \$5,000 Grant with Urban Forestry to plant trees!!

A team of Old West End residents is heading up a project to improve our urban forest. Here is what the team have been planning, and please know they are always looking for volunteers.

The Tree Nursery began last year with much success, and we are grateful to Collingwood Presbyterian Church for allowing the nursery to be placed on the church's land. This project is designed to plant trees in the 43610 and 43620 zip code areas.

For homeowners, landlords, organizations and others in the 43610 & 43620 zip code area small trees can be provided and some larger trees as well, Michael Szuberla is your contact for this initiative, and he can be reached at mszuberla@yahoo.com or 419-245-4539.

Also, your help is needed for workdays at the nursery (Floyd & Horton), 10:00AM-Noon, the last Saturday of each month, March 25th, April 29, May 27, June 24, July 29, August 26 & September 30. We are looking for people to sign up to regularly visit the tree nursery to inspect the trees and the irrigation. Consider volunteering to do a 15-minute nursery inspection one day a week (training will be available).

Finally, there will be a couple of Spring Potting Parties at Ohlman's Nursery and the Floyd Street Nursery.

"Coalition for Peaceful Toledo Neighborhoods"

A meeting was held at Glenwood Lutheran Church inviting all Old West End residents, on Thursday, February 16th. Four former Mayors were there and they were seeking input on how to better help our city curb the gun violence. Forty one (41) people attended this meeting, 31 from other neighborhoods. The Mayors have previously met with many other neighborhoods and after this meeting they compiled their information into a 12 point Ordinance and declaring it an emergency to our city leaders. A Press Conference was held on February 18th in front of the Government Center.
