Dear Old West Enders,

Since it's the 50th Old West Festival, the Golden Jubilee, I wanted to share some Festival trivia, drawn from research at the Local History section of the library and from an August 2000 Blade retrospective.

-Many know that the parade during the OWE Festival finds its roots in the King Wamba Carnival or "Mardi Gras of the North" celebrated in Toledo in 1909.

-In order to play up Toledo's nominal Spanish connection, they invited the actual King of Spain.

-King Alfonso XIII declined the invitation but sent an emissary who brought a sword from the famous sword makers of Toledo which I'm told still hangs in the office of The Blade.

-Toledo, Ohio, became the first towntwinning city in North America through its relationship with Toledo, Spain. They were formally recognized as sister cities in 1931.

-Continuing to play with Spanish connections, these carnival party planners selected a little-known King Wamba, who ruled Visigothic Spain from 672 to 680, to become the name and face of their international carnival because the capital of Spain at this time was... Toledo. (I love imagining this scene. They're looking for a King of Spain who ruled from Toledo, and then a nerd in a three-piece suit who had read Charles Morris' 1898 volume, Historical Tales: Spanish, says, "What about Wamba?" And the room goes wild because it's undeniably fun to say.)

-The planners, a handful of the city's wealthiest citizens, styled their planning team as the Mystic Order of Odelot. Yes, Toledo spelled backwards.

-There's a fun myth about how Wamba was selected to rule. You will hear it if you come to the Coronation Ceremony following the parade on the steps of the Art Museum. The historical Wamba seems to have had his head shaved like a monk in his sleep by order of a usurper and was forced to step down from the throne because this mark of holy order invalidated his claim to rule.

-The place of the 1909 coronation of King Wamba and Queen Sancha is now called 'Toledo Spain Plaza' and has underTuesday, May 9, 2023


gone a transformation as 'Peace and Healing Commons.'

-Visionaries Mark Moffett and Condessa Croninger brought esoteric Toledo history into the present by staging the King Wamba Carnival Parade during Festival. This has now become an annual tradition with new Royals selected each year by the Parade Committee. Also, several of these royals have queered ideas of what are kings and queens in fantastic ways.

-The Wamba Carnival did not return in 1910. The populace - which had really picked up Wamba fever with Wamba cards, Wamba cigars, and even a Wamba baseball league - was not really allowed to do anything other than spectate until the last day of the Festival was a 'free admission' day with masks permitted. (Then things got wild.) According to one historian, "Wamba Week was too aristocratic to become the basis of a folk festival."

The 50th Golden Jubilee of the Festival is a different kind of carnival. It's a festival put on by neighbors for neighbors, for the city, and for anyone else lucky enough to attend. If you want to be a part of a carnival like this you can join your neighbors who have put in so many hours to plan and organize this event by volunteering for a few hours on June 3rd and 4th; house docents and Children's Activities are an area of special need.

Monthly Security Tips

As we enter the spring break and summer travel seasons, remember to keep your homes secure to limit opportunities for misfortune.

• Keep it simple, Lock your doors and windows.

- Instead of keeping a spare key in a common location (like a mailbox, under the doormat, or on a nail behind the garage) consider a more covert approach. Wrap the key in foil, or put it in a small container, and bury it where you can easily find it if you need it.

WOMEN OF THE OLD WEST END CELEBRATE

DAVID & LESLIE NEUENDORFF

On Sunday, April 23, friends and neighbors gathered at the Libbey house for a reception to say Thank you to Dave and Leslie for all their years of efforts in helping to "preserve" this neighborhood they called home for 47 years. In August of last year, Dave & Leslie moved to Bowling Green, Ohio to be closer to their daughter, her husband and their four grandchildren.

Here is a little history of the Neuendorff's that you may not know:

Dave grew up in Toledo, Leslie in Michigan. Dave and Leslie both graduated from Michigan State University, David with a degree in Elementary Education and taught middle and elementary school in the Bedford Public School district for 38 years. Leslie, graduated with a degree in Journalism and worked for the Toledo Chamber of Commerce, and for 25 years was a tutor for the University of Toledo. Much a part of her personality ...when Dave asked her for their first date she replied "I suppose so". And here is the rest of the story.

After attending an Old West End Festival in 1974 Leslie declared that they should move to the Old West End. Thus began their journey of involvement with WOWE & the OWEA and the many needs for this innercity neighborhood. Two children, Sarah & John did

not slow them down. They realized there was much to do and that they could help to make a difference. And they both did.

David & Leslie, as community activists and organizers, participated in down-zoning of the OWE in 1978.

Dave worked with Barb & Don Brundage, Peggy O'Neill and others on a 10 year project to force the removal of the old St. Luke's abandoned hospital. There were many hurdles but in the end (and after 10 years) the neighborhood took ownership of the site which is now the Agnes Reynolds Jackson Arboretum thanks to the efforts of Dave, Kent Illenden, Dennis Lange and many others.

Dave & Leslie both worked on the redevelopment of the Plaza hotel site after an arson fire. David and Leslie both volunteered on various home tours for both the OWE Festival and Tours de Noel.

Dave was one of the founding members of the Toledo Urban Forestry Commission. Leslie was Neighborhood Newspaper Editor (yes we did have a newspaper for the OWE). She



also helped with the Festival Guide Book (WOWE), attended many City Council Meetings with Dave, and was Dave's Message Service before answering machines and cell phones.
