Did you know that you can donate to Old West End Security even if you have "commitment issues" and don't want to become a full fledged supporter??! You can go to www.oldwestendsecurity.com and use your credit or debit card and donate any amount you're comfortable with! Every \$25 (which is a monthly subscription fee) pays for 2.5 patrols right here and now. Every penny of subscriber money goes DIRECTLY to paying for patrols, and we ALL want more of those don't we! The small amount of overhead OWES has is paid for by other funding and/or the fundraisers we do. So talk to your neighbor and let them know that \$275 a year for a home owner (one month free when paying a full year), or \$165 for a renter, will get you a year's subscription and 30 more patrols for our entire neighborhood a year. The more we make this neighborhood an unfriendly place for criminal elements, the more we make it *extra friendly* for new home buyers, kids, and all we love here, which protects ALL our investments in the short AND long term. So even if you don't right now feel you can commit to OWES as a full time member, but decide once every few months you'd like to sponsor some extra patrols, go to the website and make a donation! It couldn't be easier and you're personally helping to protect this neighborhood we all love so much. Win, win, win!!




