The OWE Preservation Committee is moving forward on preservation of the Collingwood Arts Center's "Tea House". Committee members cut boards for the unsecured exterior openings; the Arts Commission and Collingwood Arts Center staff held an Art Day to have volunteer artists design and paint the boards which will be installed prior to Festival. Will Greed and Inactivity Determine the Future of Lake Erie?

The most valuable natural resource we will have this century is potable water. We must do everything we can to preserve and protect this national resource. Protecting our fresh water from pollution should be one of our nation's sacred duties to the future.

Those of us who are older residents of the City of Toledo have seen decades when the Maumee River Watershed and Lake Erie were considered unspoiled, and other decades when they were considered so polluted that it was a media event when Ned Skelton (County Commissioner) swam in the Maumee River to indicate it was safe again. From a Blade article March 7, 2011 "But pollution in the Maumee was no laughing matter, and a typhoid shot wouldn't have been a bad idea, in retrospect. Three years after Skeldon's swim, the federal Environmental Protection Agency described the state of the Maumee in harsh terms in a 1975 report: The Maumee River estuary, for much of its fifteen mile length, and its tributaries in Toledo are polluted. Sludge banks, oil slicks, and sewage stenches foul the area. ... anyone who cares to walk along Promenade Park may see the sludge bubbles, tally their tiny telltale oil slicks and (especially in summer) inhale the unmistakable fragrance of decomposing excreta. The mouth of Swan Creek is frequently septic and smells it... " From declarations that Lake Erie was dead to restored. To again seriously threatened today.

The loss of potable drinking water in the City Of Toledo affecting up to 500,000 people for three days centered the attention of the world on the health of the Maumee River Watershed and Lake Erie once again. Though we got through last year without a loss of potable drinking water, the region was in a drought condition. What this summer will bring is unknown.

Due to the severity of the situation and the long term potential of repeated drinking water crises affecting the lives of eleven million living around Lake Erie regional citizens took action.

Mike Ferner was the catalyst for the formation of the group called ACLE. ACLE formally known as Advocates For A Clean Lake Erie decided to unite the power of citizens to make Lake Erie safe, drinkable, swimmable, and fishable again. Through an effort of self education and garnering resources it was determined that the current water crisis is the direct result of the creation in the last decades of hundreds of CAFO's (Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations) some identified due to their size and supposedly being regulated and some smaller left unregulated.

What ACLE has discovered is that the size of these facilities is creating huge amounts of urine and fecal animal wastes that are stored in huge ponds and then are being spread on fields in such quantities that the land cannot sustain the applications. So much animal waste is being deposited onto the Maumee Valley Watershed that it leaches into drain tiles, flowing to ditches, to streams, down the Maumee River to Lake Erie providing the nutrients for harmful algae blooms producing harmful toxins and slowly destroying Lake Erie. Ohio Department of Agriculture regulates livestock farms with over 10,000 swine weighing less than 55 lbs., over 30,000 chickens (liquid manure handling systems), over 125,000 chickens except layers (other than a liquid manure system), over 82,000 laying hens (other than liquid manure systems).

There are over 140 registered CAFO's in the Maumee River Watershed generating over 700 million gallons of untreated urine and animal waste - more than the sewage of Los Angeles and Chicago combined - dumped every year on farm fields draining into Lake Erie. Polluters contaminate our water and pay nothing. We pay with our health a larger water bills.

ACLE will be marching in the Old West End Festival Parade on Saturday, June 3 again this year. Join the march to protect your drinking water. ACLE meets every third Wednesday at Grace Lutheran Church, 4441 Monroe Street Toledo, OH

Write and call every member of the Federal and State government who represents you and insist that they not allow the twenty percent of fresh water in the world on our doorstep be destroyed by the greed of a few agricultural corporations and the inactivity of the Ohio EPA who is entrusted to protect the natural environment.


