
The View from the Sidewalk

holidays The are just around the corner! This can often mean travel plans to see friends and

loved ones. Here are a few safety tips to consider prior to heading out:

- Avoid posting your travel plans on social media
- Use a timer in several areas of your home that will turn lights on and off at the times you would normally do so
- Leave an extra key with a trusted friend in case of emergencies - or to check in while you're gone.
- Stop your mail and paper delivery or have a friend pick it up daily
- Keep valuables and gifts out of sight
- Leave your curtains in the normal position, doing something different with them or leaving them closed in the day time is a dead give away that no one is home
- Ask a neighbor to park in your driveway occasionally
- Install motion activated lighting (there are battery operated one available) out-
- · Ask a neighbor or friend to shovel walkways and driveway as you normally would if needed
- Make sure smoke detectors and alarm systems are working properly
- Have a neighbor take out and bring in the trash if you plan to be gone for the week
- Lock up and check all the windows and doors to be sure they are secure

Burglaries tend to increase during the holiday season, so it may be worth this extra attention to help avoid being targeted.

How does WOWE use the Dollars Raised from their Fundraising Efforts

Each year, following Tours de Noel, WOWE establishes its annual budget. At least 75% of the net revenue from our fundraising efforts is then used to financially support programs and projects within the OWE that coincide and align with our Mission.

2017 was an unusual year, and one we are most proud of. WOWE went well beyond our "standard" 75% to help a neighbor in need make necessary repairs to bring their porch up to code, allowing them to participate in a house painting project with the Department of Neighborhoods. WOWE was thrilled to help this neighbor, save a porch, and help beautify the neighborhood at the same time.


