
First, this article is not being written to be negative in any way ...it is about awareness.

Here is the breakdown of the current board as per the OWEA's website showing eight members on the board. 100 percent of the board members live to the north of Bancroft, fifty percent of the board live on the north side of Delaware, twenty-six percent live on the same block. - Don't announce your travel plans **over social media.** A study of ex-burglars found that 4 out of 5 used social media sites like Twitter and Facebook to identify unoccupied properties.
- Use holiday lights to light up your house and the neighborhood. Lights help keep the bad guys at bay.
- If you are away for a few days, let OWE Security know (supporters get 1 week free driveway checks)
- Make it look like someone's home. Put your lights on a timer, for example. Have a trusted friend or neighbor pick up your

- A 20-pound frozen turkey can take up to five days to thaw out so plan ahead.
- Turkeys need to be cooked to an internal temperate of 165 °F.
- Leftovers need to be refrigerated within two hours after serving.


