Dear Old West Enders,

At the 'Ask Me Anything' event with Adam Levine, Director of the TMA, last month, I got to ask Adam what was something he wished more Old West Enders recognized. He thought for a moment before saying, "That there are other neighborhoods around you." He went on to say that the Museum does not envision itself inside the Old West End, but as a vital member of neighborhoods 360 degrees around it, preserving a vision of once-continuous neighborhood that I-75 bisected. Their focus on 'belonging' changed their perspective.

The point I took from Adam, that the Old West End can often be oblivious to the neighborhoods around it, was hammered home for me when I attended the Cherry Legacy Project's 'Getting Healthy Zone' neighbors' meeting. I walked into a room at Wayman Palmer YMCA where nearly forty leaders and community members sat to address the health and well-being of the area. When I announced who I was and the organization I represented, the OWE Association, there was a gasp of surprise around the table. I guess they are not often visited by members of the OWE Association. When I asked for clarity on which neighborhood, the facilitator replied that the 'Getting Healthy Zone' targeted 43608, 43610, and 43620. The entirety of the Old West End lies in this 'Getting Healthy Zone.'

I realized in that moment I had the same blind spot that Adam mentioned. I've been so caught up in OWE life that I have not paid closer attention to this amazing initiative. Here are their neighborhood goals.

Some of their work lies east of Collingwood, yet a number of their goals line up with the Association's objectives. For example, they provided funding to Habitat for Humanity to replace five roofs, at no cost to the homeowners, and they also partnered with LISC to renovate and sell six homes. Furthermore, the Financial Opportunity Center on Franklin helps people to repair credit and move towards buying a home. I also want to give a shout out to our neighbor Connie from Lawrence! She attended the meeting as a neighbor.

This gathering also provided a place to vent frustration. The shooting at Detroit and Central had taken place the day before and our neighbors voiced their frustration that this incident happened at a place where they had all predicted some sort of violence would occur.

I bring this all to you so that you know what your resources are.


