Dear Old West Enders,

November is here and as you know, November means that it's time to vote. At our Candidates Night in October, District 4 Councilwoman, Vanice Williams, remarked that we are her most active constituents, by a long shot. That's something I really appreciate about our neighborhood: we value civic engagement and politicians notice. I hope that we keep this up and grow our reputation as an active political community by voting in the General Election on November 7th. Not only are we democratically expressing our will and values, we're also showing our influence to One Government Center. When we're asking city leaders to work in a way that maintains the historic character of our neighborhood or when we're asking them to fund projects in disinvested sides of our neighborhood they will know that we are active and engaged voters when they see the percentage of Old West Enders who turnout next week.

Our November meeting, November 21st, is also our election as an Association. **David Kosmyna, Pamela Johnson**, and **Natalie Gray** formed our nominating committee. OLD WEST END Warding Off Porch Pirates in the Old West End

SECURITY

Living in the historic charm of the Old West End comes with its parks, but as we approach holiday season (and

perks, but as we approach holiday season (and the convenience of online shopping) safeguarding our deliveries has become paramount. Here are some tips to outsmart those pesky porch pirates and keep our neighborhood safe:

Strategic Delivery Instructions: When placing online orders, provide specific delivery instructions. Consider asking delivery services to place packages in inconspicuous spots or with trusted neighbors. Communication is key!

Secure Drop-off Locations: Consider installing a secure drop box or locker on your property for deliveries. This adds an extra layer of protection, ensuring that packages are

out of sight and reach of potential thieves.

Temporary Package Holding: If you're planning to be away, consider redirecting packages to a secure location, such as a local post office, or using delivery lockers available in the community.

Lighting Matters: Illuminate your porch and entryway with motion-activated lights. Well-lit areas are less attractive to thieves who prefer to work in the shadows.

Community Signage: Display signs indicating the use of security cameras or a neighborhood security. Visible deterrents can dissuade potential thieves

from targeting our community.

Although far from foolproof, implementing these security measures, may help protect our items from porch pirates. Let's keep the spirit of our historic neighborhood alive by fostering a safe and vigilant community.


