I have heard comments from several people, both current and past residents, about how good the area looks now. The landscaped front yards look especially great, and masses of day lilies, now long gone, added to the scene. Many houses have been painted, and the porch renovations have progressed. One, on Scottwood, where the owners replaced a long-gone porch the width of the house, looks like it has been there forever. The lot where the duplex burned has been seeded and looks good. Someone suggested getting an original Sears Roebuck bungalow plan for the lot, but even that probably wouldn't meet current requirements.

Hmm, did you know that after a soaking rain or even from a hose, those pesky weeds and grass in the cracks in your sidewalk pull out pretty easily?

I was pleased to see the butterfly garden at ARJA, and had been thinking about suggesting putting one in. I don't see the variety of butterflies that I used to, even on my butterfly bush (Buddleia), but I did see a monarch and a yellow tiger swallowtail while I was delivering the Historic Times last month.

The herb garden doesn't get the use it deserves. Try caprice salad: diced tomatoes or halved grape tomatoes, tossed with good olive oil and a little balsamic vinegar, minced or sliced basil from the garden, and grated or shaved mozzarella cheese. There is also a good crop of parsley. I have both in my garden and enjoy them. You could too, they are there for the picking.

Information Regarding COAs

"Any exterior work, including repairs, on any property (contributing, non-contributing, or vacant) located in the Old West End, Vistula, or Westmoreland Historic District must receive a Certificate of Appropriateness before the work begins (See TMC 1103.0306 Certificate of Appropriateness). If you have a question about the appropriateness of the work you want to do, or about whether a certificate of appropriateness is required, please call the Plan Commission at 419-245-1200 and staff will discuss it with you.

Failure to obtain a Certificate of Appropriateness prior to performing work will result in a stop work order from the Division of Building Inspection and the applicant will be required to remove all improvements. Failure to comply will result in litigation. In addition to a Certificate of Appropriateness, a Building Permit must be obtained. Please contact the **Division of Building Inspections** at 419-245-1220 for more information".

BANCROFT STREET LIGHTS AND TRAFFIC STUDY

UPDATE:

Bancroft Street Lights

In a recent conversation we have learned that the Bancroft Street Lights will be installed sometime in late September or early October. The Bancroft Beautification Committee will continue to monitor.

Bancroft Traffic Study

As reported in last months newsletter plus an update.

The Bancroft Beautification Committee has also been working with the City of Toledo Transportation Dept. to move forward on a Traffic Study that was promised to be executed after the Bancroft Bridge reconstruction was finished and open to traffic. The bridge was opened last year in June. To date we have been told that they (the Transportation Dept) does not have anyone to conduct the study. We are moving forward with this as this delay is overdue and unacceptable for the committee and our neighborhood.

UPDATE: This study was requested as part of the meetings that were held to reconstruct Bancroft a couple of years ago. The BBC's concern at that time was that without a traffic light at Parkwood how would traffic slow. We were assured that the bike lanes and the new designated parking on Bancroft would definitely slow traffic. We know that it has not slowed traffic PLUS along with that a number of accidents on Bancroft near Scottwood have occured. There are "line of site" issues for motorist going south on Scottwood who are tr trying to merge on Bancroft or cross (going south) to the other side of Scottwood at Bancroft as well. The BBC has also asked for ticketing of the cars on Bancroft, some motorist doing as much as 40+ miles per hour. The BBC has requested that the traffic study be done immediately. If it is held up for some reason we will not accept a study done in the winter as there will not give an accurate account of pedestrians crossing Bancroft, cars crossing Bancroft + car traffic on Bancroft. Summer will give a much more accurate account with so many people (pedestrians and cars) out and about. Winter is a poor time for this study. We will keep you posted.


