
Back on the sidewalk, we saw some changes, houses that had been painted, and, surprisingly, a house on Scottwood that is having a long-gone porch roof replaced. There are other works in progress and we are looking forward to seeing them completed.

This is from the street, not the sidewalk, there is a fence on the north side of the I75 north exit that has been covered with weed trees, and one has had branches, both live and dead, extending over the sidewalk and curb lane of Detroit Avenue, beyond being an eyesore, probably a safety hazard. I called the Forestry Division and was told it was ODOT property. I called ODOT and was told it would be checked on and later, that they were checking ownership, but I never heard any more. Last time I passed the area, some of the trees had been taken out.\*

We went in early July to a family reunion in Idaho and stopped in my mother's hometown in Montana. My grandmother had volunteered at the Carter County Museum, so we spent some time there. It's dinosaur country, with bones and minerals, but the local history area had an interesting item, a stovetop canning oven that used steam instead of boiling water, called Conservo, made by The Swartzbaugh Mfg. Co., in Toledo, Ohio!

#### **City of Toledo Curfew Law**

If you are under the age of 11 and are a resident of Toledo, your restricted hours are from 10 pm - 5 am. If you are between the ages of 11-15, and a resident of Toledo, your restricted hours are from 11 pm - 5 am. If you are 16-17 years old, and a resident of Toledo, your restricted hours are from 12 midnight - 5 am. During restricted hours you are not allowed in public places or on city streets without a parent or legal guardian. Exceptions include 1) That you are on your way directly home from work or a lawful adult sponsored and supervised activity or event, or 2) You are responding to a lifethreatening emergency at the direction of, or on behalf of, your parent or legal guardian.


