Dear Old West Enders.

In late July, I attended the Toledo City Council meeting, alongside John and Kira Alvitre, Dave Kosmyna, and Michael Walker to show our support for the Ohio History Connections grant for the OWE Historic District Style Guidelines. At the end of the meeting, our neighbor, Council Person Nick Komives, shared what happened at Love Fest. A UHaul full of red-shirted, masked, white men with tiki torches came and lined up outside the party, throwing Nazi salutes and shouting into a megaphone. Rather than center these Nazis, Nick emphasized the rapid response of law enforcement, the concerning lack of public alarm and awareness of the incident, and most of all the courageous response of attendees and Equality Toledo's organizers of Love Fest. They just turned up the music and danced. They refused to let the Nazis define the message of the event. Love overpowered and outlasted hate.

I tried to imagine where I would have tried to locate myself had I been present, but ultimately I recognize that my individual response is not as important as a collective response. Our values, communicated in our bylaws, are clear on this point: the Old West End Association will "create and maintain a community atmosphere that encourages a harmonious neighborhood that celebrates diversity and inclusion and stands against racism and all other forms of discrimination." We need a collective response to threats to our neighborhood.

The Old West End Association is an assembly we can start. We gather and decide upon such collective actions in line with our values. At our July Meeting, the OWE Association voted to spend up to \$700 to support our friends in the OWE Social Circle (an unaffiliated 'commit-

tee') to win the 'Best Float' at Pride for a third year in a row, a historic Three-peat. As Dave Kosmyna pointed out in the discussion, this seems like an especially important move to make given the possibility of unwanted guests attending Pride as they did the Love Fest. It's our own way of dancing in the face of Nazis and showing Toledo once again what kind of neiahborhood we are.


Imagine what else we might be able to do if we acted as one neighborhood on an issue.

Imagine if instead of five Old West Enders showing up to a City Council meeting, we had twenty-five showing up, urging Council to fund a plan to replant our tree canopy throughout the whole neighborhood. Imagine if we organized a development plan that allowed neighbors and people who love our neighborhood to fund projects like 624 Delaware and the Arboretum so we would not rely so heavily on one critical, weather-dependent fundraising weekend.

You have a chance to participate in pulling in this kind of action. For the rest of this year, the Association will begin strategic planning. We will invite responses from a broad survey so that you can tell us how we should prioritize our spending. We will also challenge each of the committees to chart their goals and plans for the years ahead, naming both what these objectives will cost and who will carry them out. Whether you are a leader on a committee, a resident in OWE Cushing-Utopia, or someone who has long been skeptical of the Association, you can add your insights to this process to shape our neighborhood's collective action.



For Your Information:

Recently there has been discussion about the abandoned and deteriorating building below.



The building at the Corner of Delaware and Parkwood Avenue is the former home of Epworth Methodist Episcopal Church.

The Church was founded in Toledo in 1894. A new church building on Parkwood was dedicated in January of 1907, and expanded with the addition of a sanctuary in 1922.

On September 7th, 1958, fire swept through Epworth Church, destroying most of the sanctuary. Investigators later found the cause of the fire to be arson, part of a wave of suspicious fires in the city. Just a week later the church was holding services in a nearby school, not missing a single day. The congregation decided to rebuild elsewhere, leaving the old shell behind. Mary Manse College, a Catholic women's school located nearby bought the property in 1960, and started raising money to convert it into a library. Over the next seven years a flat roof replaced the original peaked

Saturday, Aug. 12 9:00am - Noon one lost in the fire, and the nave was converted into a three-story library holding 52,000 books. A 154-seat auditorium was installed in the basement, along with audio / visual rooms and offices. As construction was completed in the spring of 1967, books from the old college library were packed up and moved across the street to the new, which was dedicated in May of that year.

Mary Manse College closed in 1975 due to financial problems. What happened after that is unclear, though in 1991 the building was bought and reopened by a small Church of God in Christ congregation, which used the first floor for services. Exactly when the church left is unknown, but the building has since fallen into deep disrepair, with water ruining the remaining books and causing heavy structural damage.
