Dear fellow Old West Enders,

Greetings from your new OWE Association VP! I am the first of many elected Board members in a rotation who will be writing to introduce ourselves in place of your usual "Letter from the President". My name is Nick Malenda and I moved from Maryland to Toledo in 2015 for a job in Perrysburg. As I was getting to know the different parts of Toledo, I discovered the OWE. My boss at the time, a fellow OWE'er gave me Judy Stone's contact information and she began taking me around to various events to meet new people and look at houses that were for sale. I met my future wife, Jane Malenda (not her last name at the time), at a "Sparkling Wines of all Kinds" wine tasting party organized by Jordan Killam in January of 2016.

In February, I moved in with Jane while she was renting from Dave Kosmyna, and I have lived in the OWE ever since. In the spring of 2016, I purchased a fixer-upper on the 2200 block of Scottwood and it took six months of hard work before we had a livable bedroom, bathroom, and kitchen. I quickly learned what a COA was and then I met my next-door neighbor Ken Schumacker at the OWEHC hearing to get a few missing fence panels approved (not as scary as you might think) for installation. Jane and I have been working on that house ever since, it seems like a never-ending project! I have found


that these houses are labors of love, sweat, and low bank balances to maintain or bring them back to their original beauty.

Due to our admiration of our neighborhood and past hands-on experience, in the fall of 2018 my wife and I began purchasing multiunit buildings in the OWE. Our primary goal is restoration, which is to return a building to its appearance and condition at a specific period in time. If we cannot restore aspects of a structure, we then focus on rehabilitation, which is a process that seeks to preserve the historic portions or features of a building while making the building compatible with a new use (such as finishing incomplete bathroom or kitchen additions, which we have had to do). The third aspect of how we focus our efforts on bringing these 100+ year old buildings into the 21st century is to renovate, which is making something function like new. Replacing period HVAC, cast iron plumbing, knob-and-tube wiring, and re-roping original sash windows are a few of the areas where renovation is typically required.

One of the ways we have been able to accomplish many of these feats have been with the help of neighbors. The first day of starting work on the Scottwood house, **Dan Finkel** came over with gloves and safety glasses and helped us tear out old carpet all night long. We repurpose as much as we can in our restorations, many items- even

This writer has been involved with this neighborhood since the early '70's. Much has happened in the Old West End past 50 years. When we moved here you could not get a Conventional Mortgage Loan. District 4 had been Red Lined by the Banking Institutions. Redlining is the discriminatory and, now, illegal practice of refusing someone credit, a loan, or insurance, or adding unfair terms in those contracts based on their race or ethnicity. The term comes from the red lines real estate lenders drew on their maps marking predominantly black or mixed-race neighborhoods. (WOWE persevered and got this changed.) This is a great story, just ask us how we reversed this practice.

> WOWE began the first Security Program in the '70's and proudly we were also instrumental in Fair Housing. Now a National Organization. Fair Housing began with us. WOWE began the OWE Festival in 1970 and turned it over to the OWE Assn. in 1985. Then we began Tours de Noel -Christmas Tours of homes decorated in their holiday finest.


#### There is so much more to tell.

#### WINTER DOES NOT STOP THE WORK IN THE OWE

We all ereceived the required public notice in December from the Toledo-Lucas County Plan Commissions that it is the law to get prior approval for "environmental changes" to our properties. This means ANY structure's exterior alteration, demolition, removal or new construction of any property to INCLUDE - fences, stone walls, sidewalks, driveways, and garages - even if a building permit is required or not required.


