Remembering Joyce Perrin

We were saddened to hear that OWE and Toledo Legend Joyce Perrin passed away in her Glenwood home on Saturday, October 4 at the age of 91.

Joyce Perrin started Any Wednesday, the longest running regular jam session in our region, in her Glenwood home in 1963. At that time, Joyce was the mother of 6 children and didn't get out very much but her friends came to visit. Joyce played blues on the guitar and many of her friends included other musicians. Blade photographer Herral Long and folk singer Dave Browning were regulars at the weekly Wednesday evening gatherings.

Joyce had a colorful life. She had been a taxi driver, yoga instructor, gallery owner, historian, actress, dancer, model, personal shopper and a shop clerk. She had travelled the world, twice kidnapped her own children over international borders, had 4 husbands and gone from eating caviar to stretching a dollar to feed her 8 children.

Her first husband was Jorge Fenton, the heir to a Mexican diamond fortune. This marriage was in 1949, produced 4 children and the opportunity to live in Jorge's Mexican Hacienda San Gabriel with servants, nannies and cooks.

Her second marriage was to Dr. Leo Janis in 1959. They were married at the Toledo Club and it was described as one of the first weddings in the club. She wore a designer dress that she commissioned from Mexico. This marriage produced 2 children.

It was at Any Wednesday that she met her third husband, poet, musician and body guard Ray Patrick. Their 1968 wedding took place at an Any Wednesday party. This fun, crazy and spontaneous relationship produced 2 girls.

Joyce's forth and last marriage was to a factory worker and artist Mark Perrin in 1972. This marriage took place on the banks of the Maumee River. She arrived in a canoe,

dressed in buckskin and a headdress of mink tails and silver bells. Mark Perrin was dressed as Davy Crockett. After the wedding, Mark & Joyce headed to Florida in a Volkswagen microbus full of art for the winter art fairs.

The last 30 years Joyce has lived in her Old West End Glenwood home. In 2012 Joyce

told the *Toledo City Paper* reporter Scott Recker why the Old West End kept bringing her back, "It's electric: all races, religions, colors and creeds. That's always exciting to find out people's different customs, beliefs and philosophies. People are very supportive. There is no jealousy or pettiness between artists; they support each others shows, and support each other with ideas."


In 1988 Joyce was honored by the Arts Commission for the betterment of the Toledo art scene and in 1996 by Civitas for improving Toledo's downtown. She and jazz singer John Hendricks were crowned Queen Sanchez and King Wamba in the annual King Wamba Carnival Parade during the 2006 Old West End Festival. They were both honored that year with the Keys to the City by then Mayor, Carty Finkbeiner.

WNWO TV reporter Greg Carson, in 1987 asked her how long she would continue Any Wednesday. Her reply was "I ask myself that every Thursday morning". She made that comment 33 years ago and continued the Any Wednesday events into her late 80s.

On a personal note, I met Joyce at an annual Old West End Christmas party over 10 years ago. I had always heard about Any Wednesday and then had the opportunity to attend many of them. Every one of them was filled with interesting people, incredible talent and of course Joyce Perrin. Many evenings were spent sharing stories and enjoying the talents of local musicians and poets. I will always remember her Bohemian spirit and that beautiful smile. I also want to publically thank Mark Tabone for caring for Joyce in her final years which included her wish to be "at home" til the end.

OLD WEST END SECURITY SOUNDINGS - NOVEMBER

THANK YOU TO ALL WHO COMPLETED THE NEIGHBORHOOD OWE SECURITY SURVEY!

Summary of Survey: We heard from over 100 neighbors. Approximately 30% of respondents were current supporters of OWES, ~25% were former supporters but not currently supporters and ~50% were non-supporters. We feel that we received feedback from a good cross-section of neighbors.

Over 72% of respondents would like patrols to return to the neighborhood. We had two questions on armed and unarmed patrols. Results show roughly a 60-40 split with regards to neighbors preferring unarmed patrols. Neighbors liked the idea of community-building. Neighborhood safety is a priority over feeling safe in one's home. Violent crime / assault was ranked as very important by 91% of respondents. Patrols as a visual deterrent, property crime, know your neighbor, weapons, and drugs were also rated as very important to over 50% of respondents.

NEXT STEPS: The board is looking at companies that are interested in patrolling without lethal weapons. We have done some initial research and are now refining our questioning of companies. We appreciate everyone's patience as the board moves forward thoughtfully. If you have any questions or concerns, please email, call or text us. You can also use the website to report an irregularity or provide feedback.


Help us bake the cookies!
